About the School

Decatur School of Ballet offers classes for adults, teens, and children in ballet, hip hop, tap, modern, swing, creative movement, lyrical, and Scottish Highland dance. Headquartered in Downtown Decatur, the school is structured on a nine-month curriculum (September-May) and offers special summer programs. Careful attention is given to placing each dancer in appropriate classes based on age, technical level, and ability. Individual evaluations are done for each student. Providing quality dance instruction by professionals in a friendly atmosphere is the foundation of our school. Decatur School of Ballet serves the needs of students who wish to dance "just for fun" and those who aim to be professional dancers and teachers. Our school welcomes people from varying racial, cultural, and economic backgrounds.

Although we are in the business of teaching dance, the development of each student as an individual is at the core of our endeavors. Experience in and knowledge of the arts help us express our individual creative and cultural human potential.

The discipline of dance training improves muscle tone, posture, coordination, flexibility, strength, and endurance. Other benefits are increased self-confidence and musical awareness. Here are the classes we offer:

Creative Movement (ages 3-4): An unstylized approach to developing basic motor skills which allows for the creativity of the child within a structure that builds basic dance experience.

PreBallet (ages 5-6): Preparation for classical ballet which includes some basic ballet technique as well as creative movement.

Classical Ballet (ages 7 up): A system of traditional dance steps and movement handed down over hundreds of years to train the body as a performing instrument. Ballet training develops strength, proper posture, flexibility, and coordination. Our carefully paced classes are designed to make ballet enjoyable and accessible for students of all ages.

Pointe (on the toes - ages 11 up): An extension of classical ballet.

Lyrical (ages 9 up): An expressive contemporary genre of dance that focuses on control and fluidity of movement. Heavily concentrated in ballet and jazz technique, dancers will develop their musicality, advance their performance skills and solidify their artistry through an understanding of expressing emotions through movement.

Jazz (ages 7 up): A truly American born and refined dance style which ranges from the lyrical soft shoe of Astaire and Rogers to the high intensity movement of television's dance reality shows. Jazz blends popular music and current dance trends with the polish and technique of performance dance. The result is the exciting stylized dance that you see on television and the Broadway stage.

Hip Hop (ages 7 up): Based on street dance styles such as "Locking," "Popping," and "Break," it is primarily performed to Hip Hop music. A must for any dance student who wants to stay in step with the current dance moves!

Modern Dance (ages 7 up): A contemporary approach to dance training. Skill building in modern dance allows dancers to acquire technique while developing movement vocabulary. Principles of conditioning, alignment, and musicality make modern dance a great form of athletic artistry.

Tap (ages 5 up): An original American dance form that lets you use your body as a rhythm instrument. With an emphasis on fancy footwork and sound, tap develops agility, musicality, and stylized movement. You will study basic exercises, time steps, and razzmatazz that make tap so much fun.

Swing (ages 13 up): Learn the mechanics of leading and following in one of the most versatile partner dances around. Vernacular jazz and the Swing Shim Sham will also be included – no partner required!

Scottish Highland Dance (ages 8 up): This introductory class will present foundational skills and basic movements which will help build strength, endurance, agility, and attention to detail. Within the class structure, students will learn about Scottish heritage as the class develops. Highland dance can be studied on its own or as a complement to other dance styles, especially ballet.

Leslie Palmer Gourley, Owner and Teacher

Leslie started her dance training at age six in Marietta and continued her dance studies in Mississippi and with the Joffrey School of Ballet in New York. Kvme Hersi-Sallid, Teacher



Jessica began her dance training at the Gainesville School of Ballet at age six. A professional performer with South Carolina Ballet Theatre, she also taught with the Columbia Ballet School before opening her own studio in Lexington, South Carolina. In addition to her classical ballet training, Jessica has performed in musical theater productions. With a B.A. degree in English and a M.Ed. in Elementary Education from Columbia College, she taught seventh grade for seven years. Jessica is a choreographer and Associate Director of Decatur City Dance.





Caleigh Santa Maria, Teacher

Atlanta-born, Caleigh Santa Maria trained in ballet, pointe, jazz, modern, swing, and tap with Decatur School of Ballet before attending Brenau University. While studying at Brenau as a Dance Major with a concentration in pre-physical therapy, Caleigh was a member of the Gainesville Ballet Company where she trained under distinguished artists such as Du'Bois A'Keen, Carl Flink, Owen Scarlett, and Regine Metayor. During the summers, she continued her dance training participating in many summer intensives within her dance studios as well as with Joffrey Ballet and The American Ballet Theater. In addition,

Caleigh is a competitive premier Highland Dancer, which she has had the privilege of touring internationally in Canada and Scotland, where she is a member of the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo Dance Company. 
Heather began her dance training at Decatur School of Ballet at age eight and continued her study with the Atlanta Ballet, the Royal Academy of Dance, and the Cleveland Ballet, where she also danced in the company. She also danced professionally with the American Ballet Theatre in New York City from 1988 to 1994, working with such notable artists as Twyla Tharp, Natalia Makarova, Jiri Kylian, and Mark Morris. Heather is also a professional chef and pharmacy technician.





Decatur School of Ballet is the official school of Decatur City Dance (DCD). Under the artistic direction of Leslie Palmer Gourley, DCD is the oldest performing dance company in DeKalb County and is currently in its 70th season. The company is a nonprofit corporation financially supported by contributions, grant funds, membership dues, and ticket sales. Six performing groups are under the company umbrella. *AboutFace* (directed by Toya Willingham) presents contemporary, modern and jazz, *The Nexus Group (Nexus Premiere, Nexus Apprentice,* and *Nexus Contemporary,* directed by Leslie Gourley and Jessica Reese) present ballet, jazz, and contemporary, and *The Rhythm Keepers* and *The Junior Rhythm Keepers* (directed by Kyme Hersi-Sallid) present tap. As a community arts organization, DCD provides quality performances for metro Atlanta audiences and outreach programs for retirement homes, schools, and community groups.

Dancers become members of DCD by audition. They are talented dancers who are either professional performers or want to make a commitment to dance as one of their special extracurricular activities. Many company dancers started their dance training at our school at an early age and progressed into the performing company. Many teachers in the school have worked with the company as performers and/or choreographers.



Decatur School of Ballet has been in continuous operation since 1947 and is the oldest classical ballet school in DeKalb County. 76 years ago, Hilda Gumm and Marie Roberts started a ballet school for young girls with just a few students in a small room over the ice cream shoppe in Downtown Decatur. In 1958, the school moved into its Church Street Studio, which was designed by architect Everett Roberts (Marie Robert's husband). In 1980, Kathleen and Ron Everett purchased the school where Kathleen had studied since age six. In 2012, the school added the Sams Street Studio. In 2018, Leslie Palmer Gourley purchased the school where she had studied, danced, and taught since 1980. 76 years after its founding, the school is still going strong, offering many styles of dance for anyone who wants to dance. Over the years, thousands of students have trained, learned, and grown at our school.







is a teen swing dance performance group co-directed by Danny Bevins and Eliza Reese and headquartered at Decatur School of Ballet. Membership is by invitation or audition. The Rug Cutters perform often during the season at community events and at Decatur School of Ballet Annual Performances.



Registration for Teens and Children

Early registration is recommended to assure a place in the desired class or classes. A non-refundable \$50 registration fee plus one month's tuition (prepayment of May 2024) must accompany the registration form included with this brochure, or available on our website.

Tuition Payment for Teens and Children

You are registering for the nine-month term September through May. You may make one full season payment or nine monthly payments. If you make one full season payment by the first day of class, you receive a 5% discount. If you choose monthly payments, each payment is the same, regardless of the number of classes in the month. Payments are due on the first class day of each month. We do not send reminders about tuition payments. If you receive a bill, it means your account is PAST DUE. A late fee of \$10 will be charged for payment received after the 10th of the month. A \$20 fee will be charged for any returned check. No deductions will be made for classes missed. Students may attend class only if tuition is current.

One month's tuition (prepayment of May 2024) is required with registration. If you must withdraw your child after the school year begins, please notify the office in writing to give official notice of your intentions. Prior to December 31, 2023, the advance tuition for May 2024 is refundable, when a month's written notice is given. After January 1, 2024, the advance tuition for May 2024 is NOT refundable.
